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Do Civic Education Achievements Influence Students' Civic Attitudes? The Cases of Latvia and Estonia in **ICCS 2009**

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Aim

To study and define the influence of students' civic knowledge and skills on civic attitudes and the sense of belonging

Question

To ascertain if there are coherences between the influence of students' civic knowledge and skills on civic attitudes and the sense of global belonging in the context of multi-culturalism

Instruments

Students test, questionnaires, European Module

Data in general

Students data form ICCS 2009 (International Civic and citizenship Education study) (Estonian N=2743; Latvian N=2602)

Sample and data





Conclusion

- **♯** Estonian and Latvian Students' civic attitudes are influenced by the level of civic knowledge and skills.
- ➡ Students with a higher level of civic knowledge and skills have more explicit sense of global belonging, the ability of adaption and life in a multi-cultural society.
- ★ For Estonian students, with Estonian as the language of tuition, civic attitudes and the sense of belonging to Europe are essentially influenced by civic knowledge and skills. For students in Latvia, with Russian as the language of tuition, who have the lowest results in ICCS test, 2009, the influence of knowledge and skills on civic attitudes is weaker.
